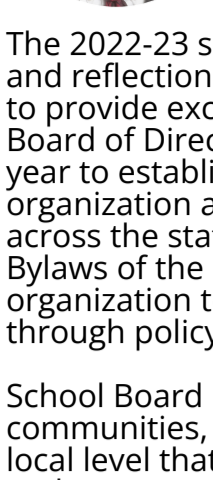

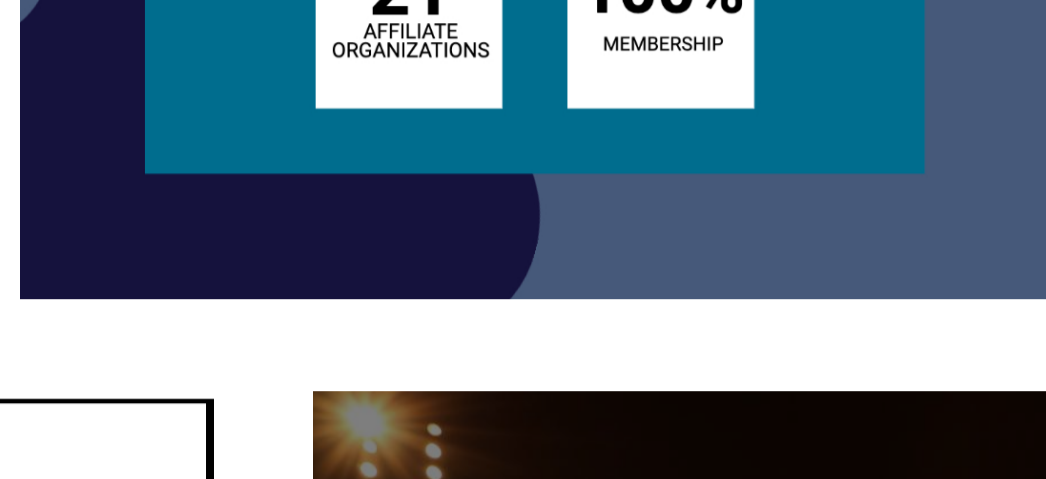

**Excellence in public education through effective leadership and the collective action of locally elected school boards.**

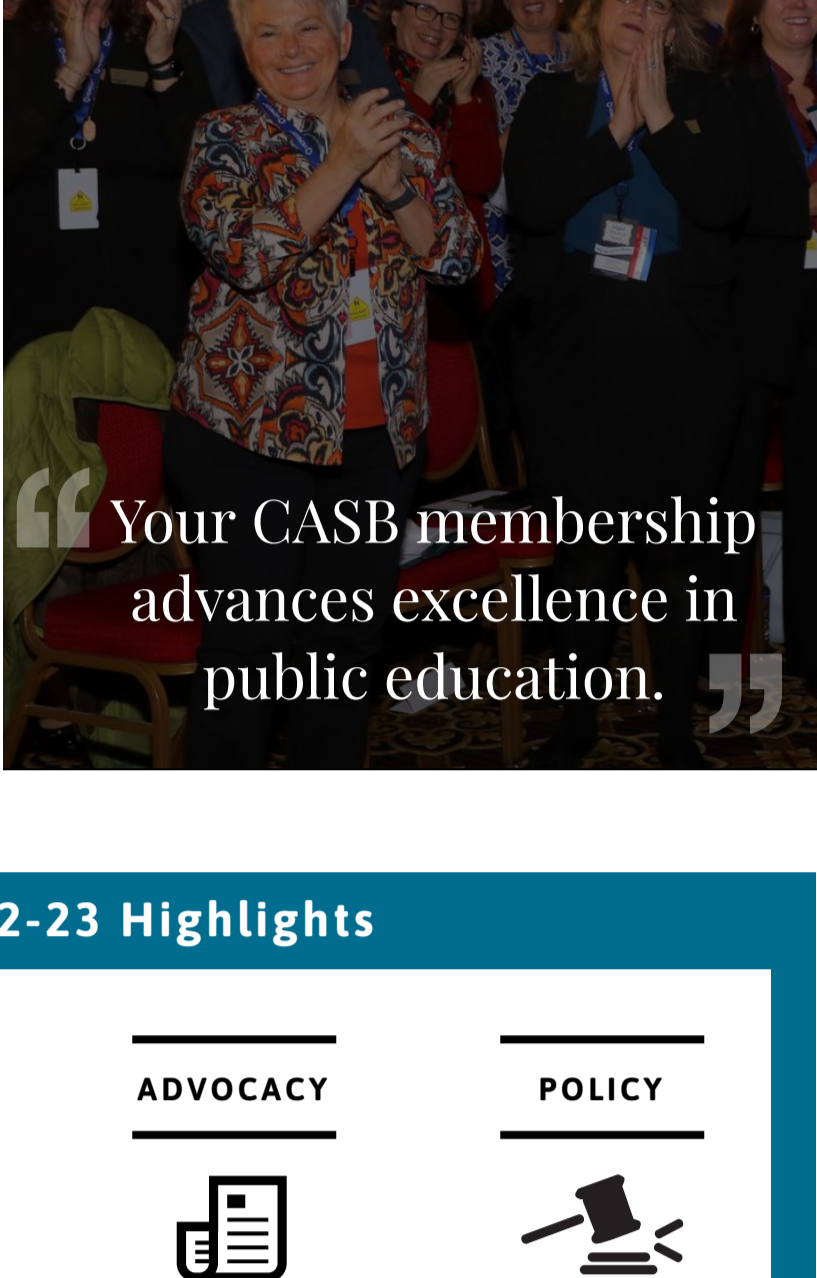

Strong, effective schools require adequate, equitable and sustainable resources.

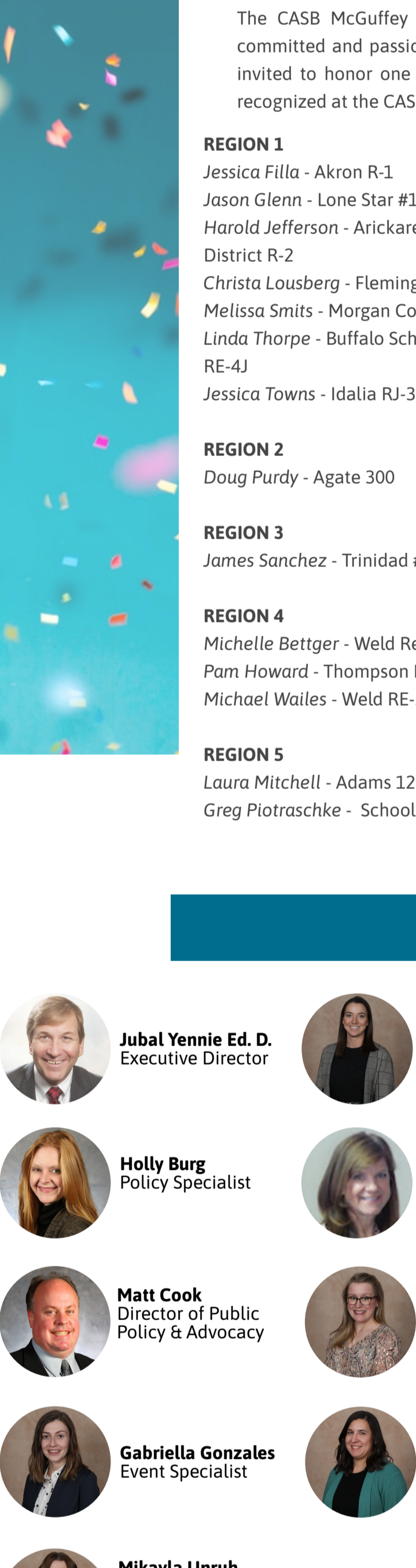
