Big Picture: 2016-2017 Pop Change

- US 325.7 million, + 2.3 million or .7%
- Colorado 5,609,445
- Ranked 9th fastest 1.4% ID, NV, UT, WA, FL, AZ, TX, DC
- 8th in total growth **75,205** TX, FL, CA, WA, NC, GA, AZ
- Uneven Growth within state and nation
 - Range in CO counties = +12,000 to -470










Colorado New Jobs and Net Migration










Colorado Population by Age 1990-2050













COLORADO'S WORKING AGE POPULATION


Projected Change in Specific Age Group Populations in Colorado, 2018 to 2025




Share of labor force by age group








Forecast Change in the Working Age Population 2015 - 2025




CO Education Services Workforce by Age






Ethnicity/Race increasing




Hispanic, Black, Asian, and other minority share

Colorado Educational Attainment by Race for 25 to 34 Year Olds, 2014





The Census is the Foundation of Democracy

- The decennial census is required by the U.S.
 Constitution (Article I, 1, § 2, cl. 3):
 - "The actual enumeration shall be made within three years after the first meeting of the Congress of the United States, and within every subsequent Term of ten Years"
- And the Fourteenth Amendment, Section 2:
 - "Representatives shall be apportioned among the several States according to their respective numbers, counting the whole number of persons in each State"

Why is the Census 2020 important to Local Governments?

\$400 billion in federal funding allocated nationally based on Census population counts

\$1,481 per person in Colorado, or ~\$8.08 billion

- Public Housing (Section 8)


2020 Census vs 2010 Census

- More ways to respond.
 - Online, Phone and Mail
- Building a more accurate address list
- Automating field operations
- Enhanced security measures -confidentiality and data security are primary concerns

The Census is Confidential

- 1. All data are protected under Title 13 of the U.S. Code
- 2. Census will never share a respondents personal information with other government agencies
- 3. Data is only released in summary tables no individual records
- 4. Records are confidential for 72 years by law (Title 44, U.S. Code)
- 5. All Census Bureau employees swear a lifetime oath to protect respondent information.
- a. Penalty for wrongful disclosure is up to 5 years imprisonment and/or a fine of \$250,000
