Protect the Tax Exempt Status of Municipal Bonds

Tax-exempt municipal bonds are tried-and-true vehicles that allow the state, school districts and other local governments to meet their critical infrastructure needs.

However, as President Obama and Congressional leaders negotiate to avoid the "fiscal cliff" and find common ground regarding tax reform, the future of the tax-exempt status of these bonds is at risk.

Repealing, replacing or limiting the tax exemption on municipal bond interest would cause local governments — and taxpayers — to pay more for their infrastructure needs. This would result in higher taxes and fees, which will translate into less infrastructure investment, fewer jobs and higher costs to school districts and other localities that are already under fiscal stress.
